Remembering Our Baptism

Lent is a beautiful time of the year. As the earth wakes up from its winter sleep, may we be awakened to the grace of God by which we live. As plants are drawn to the light which gives them life, we turn to the light of God and away from the darkness of sin throughout the year, but especially in this season. We have begun by remembering the eternal promises of God as the sign of the cross was made on our foreheads. Through this sign, we remembered that we are mortal and that the God of all time will sustain us through this life and in to the next. Lent is a time to remember our baptism, to remember who we are and whose we are.

On the five Sundays of Lent, we will look back to the covenants made to our ancestors in faith. Remembering these eternal promises add another layer of meaning to our understanding of the covenant made to us in baptism.

We have considered the salvation of Noah and his family as they are preserved from death in the waters of the flood. We will consider the covenant made to Abraham and Sarah and how this eternal, irrevocable promise impacts our understanding of baptism. We will look again at the Ten Commandments and consider how they guide us in living out our baptismal covenant. We will read again how Moses held up a sign for the healing of the people and relate it to cross upon which Jesus was raised. Finally, we will explore the new covenant which has been written on our hearts according to the prophetic words of Jeremiah.

The month will culminate in the passion of Our Lord which made our salvation possible by his glorious victory over death and the grave for us and for our salvation.

As we walk together, learn new things together and remember the covenants, may we connect the new life given to us in baptism to the lives of those who walked this path ahead of us so that we might live fully and connect to those who join us on the paths of this life.

Our history is a rich one. The faith we have been given is indeed a mysterious and wondrous thing. Together let us consider them so that we might praise our Lord together at the end of our journey through Lent, to the cross and tomb, and on to new life found in the resurrection of Jesus, our Savior.




