Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon we will enter the season of Lent. As we begin, we receive the sign of the cross upon our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. The cross is drawn with the ashes of palm branches which were waved in celebration and were laid on the road to soften the path of the animal which bore Jesus into Jerusalem. These ashes remind us of our mortality and the briefness of life. We hear the sobering reminder that we are made of dust and to dust we will return in the liturgy for Ash Wednesday.

The cross reminds us of his sacrificial love. It reminds us to imitate Jesus in denying ourselves and taking up our own crosses as we follow him. For the early disciples, taking up the cross meant risking one's life in order to follow Jesus and his teachings at a time when the forces of evil sought to destroy them. To take up the cross meant a literal death.

In our day, we don't face the persecution and the threats of death as they did, but the things which would draw us away from Jesus are ever present. The crosses we bear are different, not literal crosses, but they represent the ways in which we strive to die to ourselves and live a new life in Christ. These crosses are not the usual things which happen to us such as accidents, economic crises, illnesses of all sorts and even death. They are the things we endure for the sake of the gospel. They are the things we set aside because they hinder our spiritual growth and the health of the community of faith. We reject destructive habits, preconceived ideas about others and judgement of others. We embrace the things which mold us in the image of Christ. These things include prayer, meditation upon the Word, fasting and doing acts of love and charity for others just as Jesus did. The things that build faith are the things we embrace. The things which destroy faith are set aside, not only for Lent but on a daily basis throughout the year.

Just as we were marked with the cross of Christ in our baptism, we are marked with the ashen crosses of Lent. In the discipline of Lent, we prepare to meet Our Lord once more in his life-giving passion, death and resurrection. May we follow his example of prayer as in Gethsemane by laying down our wills in order to do the will of our heavenly Father.




