It's been a long time hasn't it? Our last worship service together in person was in late March during the season of Lent. Since then we've been away from the church throughout the entire season of Easter and much of the current Pentecost season. I've missed seeing you all, worshipping together, and sharing Holy Communion with you.

On Tuesday evening, Aug. 25th, during a telephonic meeting the church council unanimously agreed to reconvene in person worship services beginning on Sunday the 13th of September. To minimize the potential of spreading the CORONA virus we will practice social distancing and take other precautions. There will be two services one at 9:00 am. and the other at 11:00 am. One will be outdoors in the pavilion and the other will take place in the church social hall. As we grow closer to the date more details will be forthcoming.

We know that many may not feel comfortable returning to church just yet. For this reason we will continue to email the church bulletin and announcements as well as my mid-week and Sunday gospel reflections. Of course all are invited and welcome to attend the in person worship services that will begin on Sept. 13th but please come only when you feel you are ready to do so.

September 13th is also the Sunday our synod celebrates the theme "God's work, our hands". The ELCA website proclaims, "This day is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America – one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor.

Service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: that all of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life – flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

You work every day to make your community a better place. Let us continue doing this work together in 2020!"

I look forward to working together with you and every member of our congregation to share the love of God by serving others in our community and throughout the world. The in person worship services that begins on Sept. 13th is just the next step in reclaiming the importance of our life together. I look forward to seeing you then or later when you feel OK to return. Until that time remember to love one another.

Sunday, August 30 and September 6: 10 a.m. to 12 noon – Holy Communion:

Pastor Larry will be at the church (weather permitting) to offer Holy Communion to individuals or household units. This will take place in the Pavilion and will take about 10 minutes.

- No appointment is necessary, but you must wear a mask and maintain social distancing from other family units.
- Per CDC guidelines, please do not attend if you have a temperature, if you are sick or have any COVID-19 symptoms, or if you are quarantining for any reason.
- For traffic control purposes, ushers will be present in the parking lot to direct the flow of traffic. Please enter on the East side of the Cemetery and circle around to the Pavilion (the middle entrance will be temporarily blocked). Please remain in your car until directed to the Pavilion.
- Individual pre-packaged communion packets will be used. Please let the usher know how many in your family unit want white grape juice versus wine.
- If you prefer to receive Communion in your vehicle, please advise the ushers.
- The Sanctuary and Parish Hall building will not be open.
- If you desire to receive communion at your home on Sunday afternoon, please call Pastor Larry and leave a message (540) 848-5325.
- Over 20 persons communed on each of three Sundays in August.

Communion – special circumstances: On an individual or a couple basis, limited at-home (on your porch or patio) communion may be administered by Sue Cook. For example, you may be homebound or have surgery or tests scheduled and would like to receive communion. If you are interested, please contact Sue via email or telephone. She will continue this option in addition to the Sunday Holy Communion opportunity.

Sunday, August 30: In-person Council Meeting 12 noon, Pavilion; Thursday, September 3: Council Meeting via Conference Call @ 6:30 p.m.: The Church Council has ongoing issues that must be addressed to ensure the appropriate planning for in-person worship services and overseeing the operations of our Church. If you have any questions or suggestions for the Council's consideration, please submit them to Rosemary Spell (preferably in writing) no later than August 30. Email to rosespel@msn.com

“Change for Hope” (Red Bucket) Outreach Requests: If you have an Outreach request, please submit it to Mary Garber via email. The Council approves these requests at their monthly meeting.

Tuesday, September 1 at 1 p.m. and 7 p.m.: PVELC and Pastor Larry continues to host two telephonic vespers services each Tuesday. The vesper service “bulletin” is available in the weekend distribution and redistributed on Monday prior to the Tuesday service. After the service, which will last 20-30 minutes, there will be a time for those on the line to share prayer requests or other concerns. Please plan to participate.

How can I become part of the Vespers conference call on **Tuesday, September 1?**

- **1 p.m.** – dial **1-888-972-9681** a few minutes before 1 p.m. Next you will be asked to enter a passcode followed by the # key (lower right key on your phone).
- Enter **68251#** (Don't forget to press "#"). This number will bring you into the conference call. Please announce your name.
- Listen to the vespers service. While Pastor Larry is providing the midweek message, you should put your phone on mute or listen only mode to reduce background noise.
- At the end of the service, participants will have an opportunity to catch up with one another.

- **7 p.m.** -- dial **1-888-790-2053** a few minutes before 7 p.m. Next you will be asked to enter a passcode followed by the # key (lower right key on your phone).
- Enter **33162#** (Don't forget to press "#"). This number will bring you into the conference call. Please announce your name.

Beginning September 13, “In Person” Worship Services: On Tuesday, August 25, the Council held a conference call to approve beginning “in person” worship services effective September 13. Over the past several months, several teams have read, researched, and studied the guidelines and recommendations for a safe and sustained return. While the logistics of having meaningful worship services “in church,” including the Sanctuary have been developed, the overarching concern remains the increasing number of COVID-19 case occurrences in Virginia. For this reason, PVELC will begin in church worship services only a limited basis – in the Pavilion at 9 a.m. and in the Social Hall at 11 a.m. Holy Communion will be offered at the end of each service.

Why not in the Sanctuary? These two facilities are easier to sanitize than the Sanctuary. With the custodial services of Cobweb Catchers, we can meet the COVID-19 sanitation and disinfection requirements on a week-to-week basis and more frequently if mid-week meetings are required. Meeting the COVID-19 guidelines is imperative for PVELC to fulfill its spiritual, legal, and moral responsibilities for the health and well being of our members, staff, visitors, and vendors.

Why an external contractor for cleaning services? During our preparation to return to in-church worship, the health and welfare of our custodians became a concerning factor. The increased

COVID-19 requirements and possible exposure overlaid onto existing cleaning and maintenance duties led to the decision to engage a commercial custodial service during the pandemic. This will help ensure we maintain heightened sanitation standards when we return to in-person worship and reduce our legal liability should an outbreak of the virus be traced back to the church. We are all anxious to return to worship in the church and we will proceed with caution as we assess our readiness to meet those requirements on a sustainable basis. Our sincere thanks to Bill and Pat Luders for their dedicated custodial services for numerous years. In no way does this change reflect on their care for our church.

While the pandemic has shifted how the community meets for worship, the congregation is providing a powerful witness of hope for their neighbors. One of the needs that has emerged since the congregation launched is the need to provide Bibles for church participants. Entering the Church: To the extent possible, the administrative staff continues to work mainly from home. All doors are locked at all times. In order to continue to keep everyone safe, we ask that congregation members refrain from coming into the church building unless necessary. If you need to be in the building, please use the Main or Social Hall entrances. You are required to wear a mask and social distance. If you have something to drop off at the church, please arrange with a staff person to receive it or leave it in the administrative mailboxes in the Main Hall. Also, a sign-in "tracking" document is in the Main Hall at these mailboxes. Please sign in and note the applicable rooms you visited. Vendors are required to do the same and are

requested to provide a contact telephone number. This will assist with any contact tracing, if necessary. The health and safety of everyone is paramount.
